ARCHITECTURAL FEATURES TABLE	
1.	bargeboard (pre 19c.) vargeboard, vergeboard - One of a pair of slopes boards at the edge of a projecting eave at a gable end; replaces or covers on of the rafters of a barge couple, often decoratively carved or scrolled.
2.	gabled central projection with <i>brackets</i> at eves; decorative <i>quatrefoil</i> within circular framework with peak of gable; pairs of 2 over 2 segmental-arched windows with <i>pedimented crowns</i> common in <i>Italianate</i> romantic house styles
3.	centrally-located gable dormer with flared eaves typical of Foursquare Prairie style architecture
4.	finial – pointed ornament at peak of roof; hipped-roof dormer, Palladian window (See Item 12. that follows)
5.	cresting, roof crest – decoration in the form of a series of ornate, pointed shapes located at the top of a parapet or roof ridge
6.	doorway – twelve panel glazing (windows) and relatively simple squared cornice framing
7.	porte cochere covered area over driveway at a building entrance
8.	bay window projection supported by decorative <i>brackets</i> ; single (clear) <i>light</i> and <i>transom</i> (stained-glass) panes with <i>pent roof cornice</i>
9.	rounded porch featuring Doric, Roman Tuscan, unfluted columns with squared capital (top) and base; turned wood balustrade between the upper and lower railings
10.	double-hung window with one-over-one light configuration and decorative pedimented crown
11.	doorway - <i>dentils</i> (tooth-looking molding feature) running below the decorative <i>cornice</i> , single <i>light</i> (individual pane of glass) and single-inlaid <i>panel</i> at bottom
12.	decorative bargeboard gable end treatment
13.	Palladian window with a central fanlight (arched window) flanked by two rectangular windows; sunburst-fan gable-end treatment
14.	second story inset dormer porch with tapered piers typical of the Craftsman style.
15.	fish-scale shingle gable end treatment; round decorative frame and four keystone elements
