



Full Interchange at Route 47 and I-90 Moves Forward

This is a very exciting time for Huntley. On September 29th, the Illinois Tollway Board of Directors approved an intergovernmental agreement among the Tollway, the Village of Huntley, Kane County, McHenry County and the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) authorizing financing and construction of a full interchange at I-90 and Route 47.

The project will include construction of six new ramps, all-electronic toll collection, bridge reconstruction on Rt. 47 over I-90, as well as local traffic signal installation and lighting improvements. The project is part of the Tollway's \$12 billion, 15-year capital program, Move Illinois: The Illinois Tollway Driving the Future. Construction is expected to begin in spring 2012, with completion of the project anticipated in 2013.

New Catch-and-Release Fishing Regulations

The Village recently adopted an ordinance regulating fishing within Village-owned ponds (such as those in the Southwind and Wing Pointe Subdivisions). The ordinance limits fishing to catch-and-release only and requires that all regulations of the Illinois Department of Natural Resources be followed. The ordinance also establishes a minimum fine of \$250.00 for those found in violation. Signs will be posted at the affected ponds. Ponds owned by homeowners associations (HOA) are not subject to these regulations, but are governed by the individual HOA requirements.

Leaf Burning

Although Huntley is located in 2 counties, Huntley's Village Board adopted the McHenry County Open Burning Ordinance to cover ALL property within the Village. Due to the relatively small size of residential lots in Huntley, leaf burning is essentially illegal for the vast majority of homeowners within Village limits. New Adopt-A-Highway Program Approved

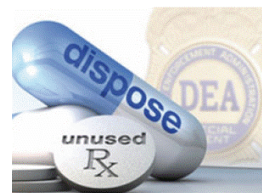
The Village Board recently approved an Adopt-A-Highway Program, which is a volunteer effort directed at trash collection along sections of Village roadways. Volunteer groups adopt a one to two mile section of roadway for a two-year period, with trash collections conducted at least two times a year (April – in conjunction with Earth Day, and October). Signage identifying the “adopting” group will be posted on the section of roadway adopted. Only Village maintained roadways are included in this program. The Village Board will hold a budget workshop on Thursday, October 27th. Budget preparation will continue through November, with a public hearing to be held on Thursday, December 8th and the budget adopted the same day.

Police Offer Safety Tips

Unfortunately, there are individuals and groups who make their money by tricking and stealing from others. No matter where you live or your age, you could become a victim of one of these scam artists. Here are a few tips to keep in mind to help stay safe:



- You aren't a lottery winner if you never bought a ticket
- If your grandchild calls for money to get out of trouble, always contact the parents prior to sending money
- Never open an e-mail if you don't know who sent it
- When instructed to wire money to someone, wait a day to determine if it is legitimate
- Never pay for a home service or project until it is complete; If the contractor insists on money up front or a deposit, try someone else
- Be suspicious of anyone coming to your door and offering to do repair work, sealcoat your driveway, trim a tree or perform other household chores
- Never allow anyone into your home unless you are certain who they are; Insist that they show you their credentials, including a photo ID
- Only use one credit card for any on line transactions
- Register your cell phone with the national "Do Not Call Registry" at 1-888-382-1222; It only takes about one minute.
- Keep an outside light on and lock your car and house doors - Light it up! Lock it up!
